Andreja Marusic is an attorney at law who has more than 14 years of professional experience in the policy, practice, and legal drafting of commercial and corporate law, financial law, foreign investments and privatization. Marusic has a significant experience in regulatory reform and business environments. She currently holds the position of Head of the Secretariat of the high-level Council for Regulatory Reform for the Government of the Republic of Serbia, which is responsible for leading regulatory reform efforts on behalf of the Government, such as conducting regulatory impact analysis of new laws and regulations. She has experience in international consulting (for the World Bank in the implementation of the regulatory guillotine in Moldova, for FIAS in the design of the business registry in Macedonia, and with USAID in business registration reform in Bulgaria). Marusic led the strategy and implementation for development of Serbia's new business-friendly commercial registry, one of the reforms which led to Serbia being identified as Top Reformer within the World Bank Doing Business Report 2006. She served on the working group for Serbia's Business Registration Law and Enterprise Law of 2004. She is currently the President of the Management Board of the Agency for Business Registers. Marusic holds a Masters of Law in International Business Law (LL.M - New York State University). She is one of the founders of the Balkan Centre for Regulatory Reform, an NGO created for the scope of giving its contribution in the creation of a strategy of reform of the legal and economic framework in the aim of its improvement and moving towards European standards.
